

Pagination







Setting Pagination in Braille 2000

- Initial page set up in Braille 2000
- Pagination for entire volume
- Do (Alt D) → Page numbering (P) → Quick setup for:
 → (Explore Options)
- Choose Textbook
 - Literary is no longer recommended in *Formats*, but still appears as a selection in Braille 2000
 - Starting print and braille page numbers : direct entry

Setting Pagination (continued)

- Options in Braille 2000
- Advance to next braille page: Do (Alt D) → Page Control (C) →
 (Options)
 - Default: To next braille page (Enter)
 - Braille 2000 automatically adds continuation numbers
- Advance to next print page number: Do (Alt D) → Next print page (N)
 - Page change line and new print page number
 - When cursor is on line 25, this command will insert blank line on line 25 and advance to next page

Table of Contents (Formats 2.10)







Setting Up Table of Contents

- Use Braille 2000 features to set up and edit Table of Contents according to Braille Formats
- Set up entire TOC in first volume (Formats 2.10.2d)
- Headings (Edit NIMAS file according to Formats 2.10)
 - Center print contents heading (e.g., TOC)
 - Volume 1 (in transcriber's note indicators); no blank line
 - Other Volumes (in transcriber's note indicators)
 - Identifiers in cell 1, following blank line; nested list format (2.10.6)







Setting Up Table of Contents (continued)

- Braille 2000 set up for TOC
- Page Numbers (2.10.7); Braille 2000: adds guide dots between entry and page number; retains 6 cell distance between text and margin; keeps line 25 blank.
- Important to check/proofread
- Sidebars and other displayed material in TOC (*Formats* 2.10.2i; 2.10.7b): Retain six cell right margin; do this manually in Braille 2000
- Retain capitalization and font attributes in TOC (Formats 2.10.8)





Setting Up Table of Contents (...continued)

- Pre-edit
 - Spacing of numbers
 - Check numbers when lesson number precedes another number.
- Highlight portion to convert.
- Do (Alt D) → Line number (L) → (Select With guide dots) → Autocontents (C) → (select options) → OK/Enter
- Check braille copy carefully. The conversion is a great time-saver, but doesn't perfectly catch every print division.

Using Table of Contents to Divide Volumes

- Volume division
 - Divide volumes between chapters or sections.
 - Use Table of Contents to help decide where to end volume.
 - On title page, use continuation numbers where relevant.
 - Print text--where print layout begins a new section on the same print page as the previous section
 - For continuation of a print page within the TOC

Adjusting Typeforms

- Typeforms in NIMAS reflect print design, and may need to be edited to align to *Formats* requirements.
- BrailleBlaster conversion allows some initial all-file conversions:
 - Remove All Emphasis from Headings
 - Remove Emphasis from List Prefixes
 - Remove emphasis from Alphabetic Reference Entry Words.

Adjusting Typeforms (continued)

- Braille 2000 set up for adjusting typeforms
- In-file editing
 - Using "Search" & Edit functions in Braille 2000
 - Highlight text portions
 - Select/edit as you go
- Adjust (Alt A) → Emphasis (E) → (Select from options in dialog box)
 → (Select from Apply To)

Book Cover & Jacket (Formats 2.8)







Book Cover & Jacket

- 2.8.1 Include information from the front and/or back covers of a book only in the first volume of the braille edition.
 - a. The cover/jacket material is inserted as the first front matter page p1, and no print page number is used. Insert a transcriber's note to explain this format.
 - (Transcriber's Note): The following material is from the back cover of the book.
 - b. Include book jacket or inside cover information not included within the text, e.g., lists of author's works, author's biography, etc.
 - c. Do not include advertising material, reviews by other authors, etc.







Book Cover & Jacket (continued)

- Use Braille 2000 search to locate book cover text within the NIMAS translation. It may or may not be included in a particular NIMAS file.
- Transfer information to braille page p1 in first volume only.
