- CNIB (Canadian National Institute for the Blind) will issue a Letter of Proficiency for UEB Technical after successful completion of a pre-test and final test
- Pre-requisite for ordering the pre-test & final test is certification in UEB

LITERARY BRAILLE PROOFREADING

Literary Braille Proofreading from NLS

- Course materials are entirely in braille and are mailed to student upon successful enrollment
- A grader/mentor is chosen as part of enrollment
- Literary Braille Transcribing Course is pre-requisite for enrollment
- Application requires an embossed letter from applicant
- Exercises consist mostly of embossed braille to proofread
- Proper format of proofreading reports is part of the course

Music Braille Transcribing from NLS

- Course manual is downloadable as PDFs or BRFs
- A grader/mentor is chosen as part of enrollment in first of the course's two parts
- The course is currently being updated to align with the updated version of the Music Braille Code
- Literary Braille Transcribing Certification is pre-requisite
- Knowledge of music notation/theory strongly encouraged
- Exercises consist of print music to transcribe

When working on an exam, you may study any resource not created in response to a question you posed after receiving the exam.

Primary sources (i.e., code books) are best.







BRAILLE FORMATS CERTIFICATION

Braille Formats Certification from NBA

- Exam consists of a miniature textbook to transcribe, which is mailed upon successful application
- Certification in UEB is pre-requisite
- Completed transcription must be printed and mailed to NBA for grading
- Grades of 80 or higher will be awarded certification

EBAE

Mathematics Braille Transcribing Course and Exam from NLS are currently based in EBAE (English Braille American Edition).

Mathematics Braille Proofreading Course and Exam from NLS are currently based in EBAE

- This provisional version of the revised lessons is for review purposes only
- Can become active after Nemeth Code update is finalized
- Students currently can only enroll in EBAE-based math courses from NLS

LITERARY BRAILLE TRANSCRIBING

Literary Braille Transcribing from NLS

- Course manual is downloadable as PDFs or BRFs
- A grader/mentor is chosen as part of enrollment
- Pre-requisites include
 - United States citizenship or residency
 - High school diploma or equivalent
- Exercises consist of print to transcribe
- Braille translation software may be used starting in Lesson 15
