## **APH Announces Robin Moore as a Member of the Board of Trustees**

She will serve as chairman of the Finance and Audit Committee. The addition of Moore reflects APH’s expanding vision of serving individuals beyond K-12 and their focus on growth both in the United States as well as internationally. This addition increases the total number of board members to 13.

Ms. Moore has more than 30 years of experience, with leadership roles stewarding corporate governance, strategic initiatives, and large-scale programs to drive value and leverage technologies to improve results. She currently serves as Board Chair of The Coca-Cola Company Federal Credit Union; and served as an alternate director for one of Coca-Cola’s largest publicly traded bottlers. In her tenure as Vice President, Chief Audit Executive, Robin set the agenda for the Coca-Cola Company Audit Committee while also serving as Secretary. Robin’s corporate governance expertise also includes establishment and leadership as Chair of Coca-Cola’s Ethics and Compliance Committee, as well as membership in Coca-Cola’s Enterprise Risk Management Committee.

“The mission, impact and history of APH are awe inspiring to me. It’s an incredible honor to join this group of talented, respected Trustees.” says Moore. “With an exciting product innovation focus, the build of the super cool DOT Museum underway, and a great team who want to maximize impact, this is an organization primed to deliver.
