

Two APH Leaders Elected President and Secretary of AERBVI

Louisville, KY (July 25, 2022) – American Printing House for the Blind (APH) is pleased to announce Dr. Olaya Landa-Vialard, APH ConnectCenter Director, and Leanne Grillot, APH Senior Director of Outreach Services, have both been elected to the Association for Education and Rehabilitation of the Blind and Visually Impaired (AER) Board of Directors. Landa-Vialard officially became president, and Grillot, officially became secretary during the July international conference in St. Louis.

"I am so honored to be the first Latina to be leading AER as President," said Landa-Vialard. "AER has been such a huge part of my personal journey in this field so I'm looking forward to giving back to an organization that has given me so much."

Olaya has served on its board of directors since 2016 and takes over for Neva Fairchild. This is Grillot's first time serving on a national level.

"I am happy to be elected to serve our vision professional community as the secretary of AERBVI," said Grillot. "My skills with organization and being detail-oriented will assist me in providing an active conduit for communication between board members with the proper notice of meetings, prompt distribution of materials, and accurate reporting of minutes."
